Dear Parents,

Our Grade 1-6 students will have the opportunity to participate in an In-Line skate program starting December 10 and running until December 19, 2025. Alien In-line will be providing skates, helmets, protective gear, and instruction for this residency.

Program Content

Many basic and advanced skating skills are taught during the Alien In-Line program. Skills introduced will vary based on students' abilities and may include; standing on skates/basic position, simple forward motion, several ways to stop, several ways to turn, safe skating strategies, road/pathway etiquette, and non-aerial jumping.

Safety and Protective Gear

Alien In-Line provides protective gear for each student (knee pads, elbow pads, wrist guards, helmet). We encourage students to bring their own helmets for each session. Bike, skateboard, and hockey helmets are acceptable. Football, BMX, ski/snowboard helmets are **NOT** acceptable.

Proper Attire

We suggest that students wear comfortably fitting clothes on skating days (not too tight and not too baggy). Skirts or dresses should be avoided. All students should have clean, dry socks.

There is **no fee** associated with this in-school activity, as the Ramsay School Parent Association will be funding our skating residency.
